


SIXTH FORM & FURTHER EDUCATION COLLEGES 2023-2024







Life in the Sixth Form at Camp Hill Boys is both exciting and stimulating. Camp Hill enjoys a national reputation for the academic standards achieved by its Sixth Form students. This is, in no small part, due to the calibre of the students themselves, although they benefit enormously from the high quality teaching they receive, the excellent pastoral support on offer and from the safe and secure environment of the Vicarage Road site.

Sixth Form Options Evening

There will be a Year 11 options evening for current and prospective students to discuss A -Level options at Camp Hill Boys. Please note that there will be no opportunity for a tour of the school during this evening.

The Application Procedure for External Candidates

Each year, we take in a number of students from other schools.

These students bring a fresh outlook to the Sixth Form and make a major contribution to the life of the school. They figure prominently in the Prefect elections and many turn out for the School in representative matches; virtually all participate enthusiastically in the numerous House activities available. Their academic results are at least as good as, and are often better than, those of our internal students. Perhaps more importantly, they are welcomed into the Sixth Form by their new colleagues and happily settle down socially.

Depending on resources, subject availability and demand, Camp Hill expects to admit about 180 students into Year 12 next year. A limited number of external admissions are anticipated each year at age 16 years for entry into Year 12; in September 2024 this is expected to be around 60. Admission is based upon an assessment of the pupil's potential to benefit from the curriculum and facilities offered by the school. This assessment is based primarily upon the pupil's educational record, including actual or anticipated examination results, with particular reference to achievement in the intended and related areas of study.

To achieve entry into the Sixth Form in September 2024, prospective entrants (both existing pupil and external candidates) must achieve:

- at least 54 points in a student's best six GCSE subjects plus GCSE Mathematics and English Language ('Best 8), where a Grade 9 is 9 points, Grade 8 is 8 points, and so on.
- at least a grade 7 at GCSE in those subjects they wish to study at A level, although taking one subject at A level with a grade 6 may be considered, except for Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry and Physics, where at least a grade 7 is compulsory



- at least a grade 7 at GCSE Mathematics for the study of Economics
- at least a grade 8 at GCSE in Mathematics to study Further Maths
- at least a grade 8 in Core and Additional Science or Dual Award, where this is studied, in order to pursue any science A level

Offers of places in the Sixth Form will be conditional on achievement of these results and capacity of chosen courses. In the event of over-subscription, priority will be given to 'looked after or previously looked after children' who meet the admissions criteria, students who attract Pupil Premium who meet the admissions criteria (up to 25% of the external intake), and those with the highest predicted GCSE scores (overall and then within their chosen A level subjects). In the case of a tie then priority will be given to those living in closest proximity to the school. Most students will study three or four subjects at the beginning of Year 12. Further Maths A level is only offered as a fourth subject. For further general information, please consult our website http://www.camphillboys.bham.sch.uk/sixth-form

The school aims to develop and maintain a thriving and successful sixth form community based on high expectations, where high standards and high levels of achievement are the norm in academic study and in all aspects of sixth form life.

The school admits up to 20 new students to the Sixth Form each September. KE Aston welcome applications from ambitious students from the Birmingham area and beyond. Financial assistance may be available for students currently studying at schools in the north-west area of Birmingham. Parents of external candidates wishing to enrol a student into the Sixth Form should read the information below.

Sixth Form Open Evening Monday 13th November 2023 5.30pm – 8.00pm

All students and their families are invited to attend speeches by Headmaster and Head of Sixth Form; visit subject leaders and students to find out more about the A-Levels and other opportunities on offer.

The minimum requirements for entry into Aston's Sixth Form are:

To achieve entry into the Sixth Form in September 2024, prospective entrants (both existing pupils and external candidates) must achieve a minimum of seven GCSE passes at grades 9-5, including at least grades 6 in English and Mathematics.

- To study a subject at A-Level a student must have achieved at least a grade 7 at GCSE in that subject (where applicable). In order to study Further Mathematics, a student must have achieved a grade 9 in Mathematics at GCSE level.
- To study a combination of Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics and Computer Science, a student must have achieved 8, 7, 7 in GCSEs involving these subjects (for example to study Mathematics, Biology and Chemistry a student must have achieved an 8 in at least one of these subjects and 7s in the others). For applicants with Double Award Science, we would expect grade 8/7 as applicable.
- To study four A Levels, students must achieve five grade 8s or above, with a grade 8 in at least three of their choices. Further Mathematics will only be considered as an additional fourth A Level where applicable.
- Pupils studying Physics must also study Mathematics.



Offers of places in the Sixth Form will be conditional on achievement of these results and capacity on chosen courses. In the event of oversubscription priority will be given to: "looked after or previously looked after children" and then those who live nearest to the school (according to the straight-line distance between home and school).

Students completing vocational courses at Level 2 will need to convert grade outcomes to GCSE equivalent scores (see www.gov.uk for further information)

A limited number of external admissions is anticipated each year into Year 12. For entry into Year 12 in September 2024 this number is expected to be 20. Parents of external candidates wishing to enrol a student into the Sixth Form should contact the school. It is not necessary for parents of existing pupils to apply formally for places in Year 12.

If you wish to apply for a place in our sixth form as an **EXTERNAL candidate**, please click on this "expression of interest" form and complete it by **midday on 26th January 2024.**

You will then be contacted with further information during the Spring and Summer term. Tours to the school may become possible during 2023 and you will be notified of these.

- 1. On GCSE results day, an application form for entry to our sixth form will become available via the link on the top of this webpage. If your results meet the entry requirements, you can apply between 8am and 1 pm. Once your application has been submitted, we will carefully consider it
- 2. If you are successful in being shortlisted, the school will contact you via an email after 3.00 pm on GCSE results day to notify you of an admissions meeting time when we will discuss your application further with you.
- 3. Meetings will be scheduled to take place in school from 10 am onwards on the Friday after GCSE results day.
- 4. You will be allowed to bring no more than ONE member of your family with you to the meeting.
- 5. Do not arrive more than 5 minutes early for the meeting.
- 6. You must bring a paper copy of your latest school report AND proof of your qualifications (GCSE results statement from your previous school) to the meeting. Unfortunately, places cannot be offered to applicants who do not bring these documents with them to the meeting.

To register your interest for a place in our Sixth Form, please complete the 'register your interest' form, which will appear on the website when KE sixth form application process opens. KE Five Ways run a post results application process do not make conditional offers, they operate a post GCSE application process.

KE Five Ways request that students register their interest using the Sixth Form Wen Page. The form will be available from 9th November 2023 until 23.59hrs on 5th January 2024.

Students do not need to upload their predictive grades, as actual grades will be uploaded onto the Results Portal on 22nd August 2024. Once the grades have been uploaded, we will offer successful students the opportunity to attend a telephone meeting on either 22nd or 23rd August 2024. Students will need to bring with them, two copies of their GCSE results. Successful students will receive a Welcome Pack and will start their A Levels at Five Ways on the Autumn 2024.

Students choose THREE subjects to study in Sixth Form.

Students who wish to study 'Further Maths' will choose FOUR subjects as they must choose both 'Further Maths' and 'Maths for Further Maths'.

All students will work on an Extended project Qualification (EPQ) in addition to their A Level subjects.

The following subjects may not both be chosen: English Literature and English language and Literature

Subject	Entry Requirement
Art	GCSE Art & Design grade 7 or above (or equivalent) and appropriate portfolio of evidence
Biology	GCSE Biology (Triple or Trilogy) or equivalent and GCSE Maths grade 7



Chemistry	Grade 7 or above (or equivalent), at GCSE Chemistry, Trilogy Science or Synergy Science and GCSE Mathematics. Many students find it advantageous also to study A level Mathematics, but this is not essential.
Classical Civilisation	GCSE essay-based subjects grade 7 or above (or equivalent). GCSE Latin is not required.
Computer Science	GCSE Computer Science (if studied) Grade 7 or above (or equivalent), OR GCSE Maths OR Physics grade 7 or above (or equivalent).
Design Engineering	GCSE Design and Technology (if studied) grade 7or above (or equivalent). Students that have not studied GCSE Design and Technology would need GCSE grade 7 in English, Maths and Science. Any additional evidence of practical ability would also be advantageous.
Economics	GCSE English grade 7 or above (or equivalent). GCSE Maths grade 7 or above (or equivalent) is also useful.
English	An English qualification (English, English Literature, Media Studies, English Language and/or Communication and Culture), GCSE level or higher, level 7 or above (or equivalent), for GCSE. A second English qualification from this list at level 7 or above (or equivalent), is also useful.
EPQ	Mandatory part of A Level Study at Five Ways
Geography	GCSE Geography grade 7 or above (or equivalent).
Government & Politics	GCSE English grade 7 or above (or equivalent).
History	GCSE History (if studied) grade 7 or above (or equivalent) OR English grade 7 or above (or equivalent).
Law	GCSE English Language grade 7 or above (or equivalent).
Mathematics	GCSE grade 7 or above (or equivalent) for A level Mathematics GCSE grade 8 or above (or equivalent) for A level Further Mathematics.
Modern Foreign Languages (French, German, Spanish)	GCSE in the language, grade 7 or above (or equivalent).
Music	GCSE Music grade 7 or above (or equivalent) is the usual standard for entry for students or an equivalent



PE	qualification such as ABRSM grade 5+ theory and practical on an instrument, will also be considered; If you are in doubt please contact us. Students are expected to play a full part in the musical life of the school by participating fully in ensembles, thereby encouraging younger pupils by example. GCSE Physical Education grade 7 (if studied) OR a Science subject grade 7 (or equivalent). GCSE English grade 7 is also beneficial. Pupils must be competent in one sport as a performer or an official
Philosophy	GCSE English Language or English Literature grade 7 or above or (equivalent). Religious Studies (if studied) 7 or above (or equivalent) is also useful.
Physics	GCSE Physics (or Trilogy Science) and Mathematics at grade 7 or above (or equivalent). It is not essential to also study A Level Mathematics, although some students find this to be an advantage
Psychology	GCSE grade 7 or above (or equivalent) in English Language and or one other essay subject such As history, RS or English Literature - strong writing skills are essential. GCSE grade 6 or above (or equivalent) in Science and Mathematics is also beneficial due to the scientific nature of the course.
Sociology	GCSE grade 7 or above in another essay-based subject such as history, RS or philosophy, and a grade 6 in English Language

Sixth Form Admissions

Entry to Year 12 is dependent upon academic attainment in GCSE examinations* and the availability and suitability of courses offered by the school. The entry requirements, which also apply to those already at the school, are: a total point score of 54 points in their best 8 GCSE grades. These 8 must include English and Maths at grade 6 or above. Candidates will be expected to achieve at least grade 7 in the subjects they wish to study at A Level. * Equivalent examinations will be considered, but only when such equivalence can be independently verified (by, for example, the Department for Education).

The School admits both girls and boys to the Sixth Form, and pupils will be considered for admission based on their academic attainment in GCSE or equivalent examinations and the availability and suitability of courses offered by the school. The Published Admissions Number for Year 12 is 250.

Applications should be made directly to the School, and not to the Local Authority. The application form is available either from the School or from its website. Conditional offers are made in the spring and confirmed after the publication of GCSE results in August.

Applications will open Friday 24th November, the submission deadline is Friday 2nd February 2024. Once we have received your application we will need receipt of your reference, you should check with your current school that your reference has been completed and submitted. You will hear the outcome of your application by 16th February 2024.

Admission to the Sixth Form is based on performance in a student's best 8 GCSE subjects plus GCSE English Language and Mathematics (throughout this document this is referred to as 'Best 8')

Points are awarded for new GCSE qualifications in English Language, English Literature and Mathematics and in all the other legacy full course GCSE subjects.

A minimum score of 52 Vesey points will be required to gain entry to Sixth Form.

Students need to achieve the minimum of a 5 in English Language and Mathematics GCSE, and a minimum of an Agrade or a 7 in the subjects (or equivalents eg: In the cases of Economics and Computer Science, we will take the GCSE Mathematics grade. In the case of Psychology we will take the GCSE Biology grade. In the case of those students opting for A-Level History, who have not taken GCSE History, they will be required to attain a 7 or better in GCSE English Language or English Literature) to be studied at A-Level. To study Further

Mathematics at A level, students are required to achieve an 8 or better in GCSE Mathematics. Priority will always be given to students who have studied their GCSE qualifications at BVGS, if they meet the published entry standard.

Bishop Vesey have 80 places allocated for external applicants.

The Sixth Form is well established with a total of around 370 students following a wide range of courses. Each year, well over 100 students leave Year 13 to continue their education at university thanks to their hard work and the support of staff.

The Sixth Form is an opportunity for students to further their knowledge and understanding in subjects already taken, or to broaden their interests and pursue courses in new areas. Changes to A Levels being introduced by the government mean that the majority of subjects will be studied as part of a two-year linear course with end of course examinations. The vast majority of our Sixth Form students will study three subjects across two years. Students wishing to study four subjects may still be able to do so if they have a high 'Attainment 8' average points score of 7.0 (Grade A) or higher.

Advanced Levels are currently studied in the following subjects: Accounting, Art, Biology, BTEC Sport, Business, Chemistry, Design Technology, Economics, English Language, English Literature, French, Further Mathematics, Geography, German, BTEC Health & Social Care, History, ICT, Mathematics, Medical Science Diploma, Music, BTEC Performing Arts, Physical Education, Physics, Psychology, Religious Studies and Sociology.

The development of leadership skills is strongly encouraged among Sixth Form students and positions of responsibility as prefects and senior prefects are eagerly sought and highly respected. The Senior Five is an important aspect of life in our Sixth Form. It consists of the School Captain and four Senior Prefects. This team has an influential role across the school. They are chosen carefully and carry out a number of duties requiring them to work alongside staff and students to ensure that the students' voice is heard and that the school's traditions are maintained and developed.

Three Subject Programmes

To study a three subject programme at our college, you must meet our minimum entry requirements, which include having a minimum of **six GCSEs at grade 5 or above.** It's worth noting that 96% of King Ed's students choose to study on a three subject programme.

Four Subject Programmes

If you wish to study a four subject programme, you will need to achieve a minimum of **seven GCSEs at grade 7 or above**. It's important to keep in mind that only 4% of our students opt for four subjects, primarily those who are studying Mathematics and Further Mathematics. UK universities make offers based upon students taking three subject programmes, and it is better to excel in three subjects rather than stretch yourself thinly across four subjects.

Fully completed applications (including Personal Statement / Career Aspiration documents) must be submitted electronically by **Wednesday 28 February 2024** for consideration for a place at the college.

Minimum Entry Requirements - For entry September 2024

The minimum requirements for entry JC College are:

6 x Grade 5's, including a Grade 5 or above in GCSE English Language.

GCSE Maths must be at grade 4 or above. One grade 4 can be replaced with one BTEC Level 2 which is graded 'Merit' or above.

In addition to the above, some subjects have additional entry criteria:

- Biology/Chemistry/Physics Grade 5 in GCSE English Language and GCSE
- Mathematics. Grade 6 in two of the following: GCSE Core Science/ GCSE Additional

Minimum Entry Requirements for September 2023

In order to secure a place at our Sixth Form, all applicants will be required to achieve at least five GCSEs at Grade 6 or above.

Applicants must also achieve a minimum of GCSE Grade 5 in English Language and Mathematics.

Typically, we expect Sixth Form applicants to be applying directly from Year 11 and to have sat their GCSE exams in the summer immediately prior to admission. Students who are applying 'out of year' will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

Subject Specific Entry Requirements

(Please note that Subject Entry Requirements for 2024 are still to be confirmed and may change slightly from those listed below)

In addition to the Minimum Entry Requirements, applicants will also need to achieve at least a Grade 6 at GCSE in the subjects they want to study at A-Level. If the subject is not currently studied at GCSE, we may be able to accept associated subjects (see download for details)

If the school is oversubscribed, applicants may need to achieve at least a GCSE Grade 7 in the subjects that they want to study. Offers will be based upon predicted grades and will be conditional on achieving those results.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

For entry in September 2024, there are four sets of criteria, depending on what programme of study you choose. Your choices are:

1. Standard 3 A level Programme:

The majority of our students will choose to study 3 A level subjects and will commit to these subjects for the full 2 years. Entry requirements for this programme are:

- At least two grade 6s at GCSE
- At least a further three grade 4s at GCSE
- You should have at least grade 4 in BOTH GCSE English Language AND Mathematics.

Please note that there may be additional entry requirements specific to particular subjects – please check each subject listing on our website carefully to ensure you understand these entry requirements.

2. 4 A level Programme:

Some very able students may choose to study 4 A level subjects. These students must commit to these 4 subjects for the full 2 years. This will include most students who choose to study A level Further Mathematics, who will pick Mathematics, Further Mathematics and two other subjects. Entry requirements for this programme are:

- At least five grade 7s at GCSE
- You should have at least grade 6 in GCSE English Language AND Mathematics.
- Check each subject listing on our website for any subject-specific grade requirements



3. BTEC Level 3 National Diploma (2 A level equivalent) plus 1 A level/A level equivalent: The BTEC Level 3 National Diploma courses are equivalent to studying 2 A levels and have similar requirements. The only difference is that other courses equivalent to GCSE (e.g. BTEC First Awards and OCR Nationals) count towards the entry requirements. To support your future aspirations, you must choose one from the wide selection of A level/A level equivalent courses we have on offer to complement your BTEC level 3 National Diploma. You will need:

- At least two grade 6s at GCSE
- At least a further three grade 4s at GCSE
- You should have at least grade 4 in BOTH GCSE English Language AND Mathematics.
- Some BTEC Level 3 National Diplomas have specific entry requirements: e.g. Science requires a minimum of two grade 4s in GCSE Science.
- Check each subject listing on our website for any subject-specific grade requirements relating to the A level/A level equivalent you wish to study alongside the BTEC Level 3 National Diploma.

4. BTEC Extended Diploma (3 A level equivalent):

BTEC Level 3 National Extended Diploma courses are equivalent to studying 3 A levels, so have similar entry requirements to A levels. The only differences are that other courses equivalent to GCSE (e.g. BTEC First Awards and OCR Nationals) count towards entry requirements for BTEC and on some courses students are accepted with either English Language OR Maths at grade 4 (see below). You will need:

- At least two grade 6s at GCSE or merits on an equivalent course
- At least a further three grade 4s at GCSE or equivalent, including at least grade 4 in GCSE English
 Language OR Mathematics, with at least grade 3 in the other one. Students who have a grade 3 in
 one of these two key subjects will be required to retake this GCSE in addition to the BTEC Extended
 Diploma.
- Some BTEC Level 3 National Extended Diploma courses have specific entry requirements: Science requires a minimum grade 4 in Maths and two grade 4s in GCSE Science; IT requires a minimum grade 4 in Maths and IT/Computer Science; Art & Design requires a minimum grade 4 in an Artsbased GCSE.
